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What Would the Passage of Denver Initiative 300 Mean to Your Business?

Members with Denver business addresses, look out! Members whose businesses are not located in Denver, but who have employees who work in Denver at least 40 hours a year on your behalf – you need to look out too. Initiative 300 is going to cost you. Castle Rock Impact and Development Fee Changes Progressing Toward Adoption

At their September 6 meeting Castle Rock Town Council approved on first reading with a 7-0 vote the proposed changes to impact, utility and development fees that will result in significantly lower net fees for residential development. Second reading is scheduled for Tuesday September 13 and will be treated as an emergency measure, allowing the revised fees to be effective immediately upon passage rather than with a delay of 30 days. Council is expected to pass the ordinance on second reading.

The revised fees are proposed to be in effect for balance of 2011 and all of 2012. Technically, the fees will remain in effect until council asks for a review; there is no mandate review schedule included in the ordinance as has previously been the case. One exception is the water and waste water fees, which will have an annual review to include both rates and fees.

The HBA and several members served on the stakeholder group established to provide input on the fees study and resulting recommendations; such involvement has once again proved invaluable to a positive outcome. City of Louisville Prepared to Consider Impact Fee Adjustments

Following a study conducted by consultant TischlerBise and with the input from a stakeholder's group on which the HBA and members served, city staff is preparing to make its recommendations to City Council regarding revisions to their impact fees. As was the case in Castle Rock and following a growing national trend, TishclerBise has recommended "scalable" impact fees. In Louisville the proposed fees are based on the number of bedrooms in single family attached and detached, with flat fees set for multifamily units. If the recommended fees are adopted, single family detached homes with three or fewer bedrooms will see a net decrease in impact fees, while those with 4 or more bedrooms will see a net increase. Single family attached homes will have a net decrease in fees; those with 3 or more bedrooms will have a net increase. Multifamily homes will have a flat rate, resulting in a decrease.

City of Boulder Reviewing its Affordable Housing Requirements

After over a year of work, the City of Boulder's Affordable Housing Task Force will present its recommendations to City Council at its September 20th meeting. Some of the recommendations include:

- Acknowledging that the new residential development community currently bears a disproportionate share of the affordable housing burden
- That the IHO needs to be improved, including possibly reducing the requirement from 20% to 10%
- Reducing cash-in-lieu fees in an effort to produce more funds for affordable housing
- Pursuing new potential funding sources, acknowledging that the costs should be shared equitably among all sectors of the community
- Leveraging land use and development review tools to encourage affordable housing by encouraging smaller dwelling units, higher density zoning in transit corridors
- Exploring ways to hold down HOA fees to owners of affordable units
